REPORT OF COUNTY PROBATION'S 2018 DAVID USAGE

Objective and Scope

The objective of the audit was to ensure internal controls are sufficient to protect personal data obtained from the Driver and Vehicle Information Database (DAVID) from unauthorized access, distribution, use, modification, or disclosure.

The audit included tests of records and other auditing procedures, as outlined in the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the County Probation Division and the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, from January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018.

Overall Conclusion

The established internal controls are adequate.

Background

Law enforcement and criminal justice officials access DAVID to attain current information related to driver records and vehicle information. The County Probation Division uses DAVID to search for probationer identification, determine vehicle ownership, and determine the validity of drivers' licenses, among other reasons. The MOU indicates that the use of DAVID and its data must be in a professional manner and that reviews of user activity are completed on an on-going basis.
